Working closely with Indigenous colleagues, community forums and learning conversations in relation to the history of First Nation Peoples and their experiences through the lenses of:

The history of colonialism, Post colonialism, Issues of sovereignty, Land Rights, Political representation and more recently: the **Statement From the Heart** and its implication for Constitutional change.

Heather has recently stopped full-time teaching in the secondary sector to concentrate on seeing the up-coming referendum through to a very positive conclusion.

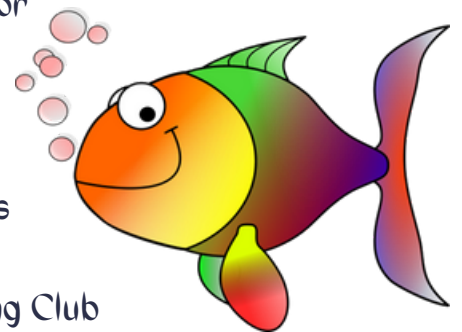

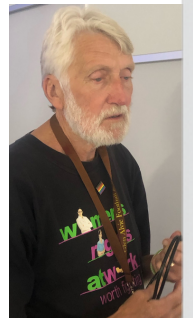


Living Library
